A typo or an error at the printers? Surely wines from one of the world's most famous Burgundy houses, founded in 1880, should be more than this...

Sometimes we'll receive an offer, price it up and think the importers have made an error — perhaps they've put a price per 12 but they mean per six or they've missed a nought off. This was certainly the case with this pair from famous Burgundy house Joseph Drouhin. We checked, and then checked again, and then again and then again etc. Low and behold the figures were correct so we tasted it and then ordered as much as we could! These two wines will fly out of the door so get in quick.





BEAUJOLAIS-VILLAGES DROUHIN 2013, BEAUJOLAIS – FR A lovely fresh raspberry, violet and peony nose with a delicious silky fruit palate. Aged in stainless steel to allow the fruit to shine through. *RRP £11.99. Parcel price £7.99 while stocks last*

MÂCON-LUGNY DROUHIN 2013, BURGUNDY – FR Floral and fruity with some nice lemon and white flower aromas. Very neat, precise and an absolute steal. Like the Beaujolais this is 100% aged in stainless steel. *RRP £13.99. Parcel price £7.99 while stocks last*

BODEGAS LUIS CAÑAS

Wines for Christmas? Wines for gifts? Wines to just kick back with and enjoy? Look no further than our favourite Rioja producer Luis Cañas. Words and tasting notes by Steph Aburrow

while back, I received a tweet from a lovely customer that simply said 'someone opened a bottle of Luis Cañas Rioja yesterday and I told them the story'. It made me smile as wine is all about stories, sharing and enjoyment. As we approach the festive period it seems incredibly apt to feature a producer that embodies these ideas. The story, or ethos, of Luis Cañas is quite simple and can be summed up in one word — family.

Luis Cañas, 88, is head of the family and still spends every day in the vineyard lovingly tending to the vines. Luis has been making wine since 1970 but in 1989 decided that his 33 year old son, Juan Luis Cañas, should take

over. Juan's approach, to age the wines for longer to increase their complexity, changed the path of the bodega forever and brought about worldwide acclaim. He has also founded a new range called Bodegas Amaren - which means 'house of my mother'. This premium range lovingly pays tribute to Juan's mother Ángeles who devoted her life to the vineyard until she sadly passed. Her legacy of striving for the utmost quality in their wines certainly shows through in this multi-award winning range.

I happened to visit Cañas a few years ago. It's an incredible place where you're welcomed in as extended family. If you're lucky enough to visit them yourself one day then you'll see first hand the care and attention to detail that the family prides itself on from the vineyard and the winery to the spectacular accommodation.

If a visit isn't on the cards any time soon then I'd suggest buying a bottle or two, gathering round your friends and family and then enjoy — it's what Luis and Juan would want."

JOSEPH PERRIER

As if the Champagnes of Joseph Perrier weren't already attractive enough, the house has now pulled out all the stops with a gorgeous new bottle shape. There's never been a better time to discover...

ounded in 1825, Joseph Perrier has been owned and run by the same family since 1888 and the affable Jean-Claude Fourmon, the current CEO, represents the 5th generation of the family. The house, based in Châlons-en-Champagne, has three kilometres of wonderful underground galleries whose origins date back to the Gallo-Roman

period. Several million bottles age here in perfect conditions for a minimum of three years before release.

CUVÉE BLANC DE NOIRS BRUT NATURE 2008, CHAMPAGNE - FR Ok, so it's not in the new

packaging but we had to include this recent release as it's the best new Champagne we've tasted for years. Do we need to go on? 100% Pinot Noir from Cumières, the grapes come from a plot that's next to one of the world's most famous deluxe cuvée vineyards. Zero dosage so it's bone dry, and good for your waistline, it's all about honey, salt and mirabelle on the nose with ripe dried cherries, kirsch, and dried fruits on the palate that develop into an intense finish. This is Champagne of the highest order. £50.00

release of their brand new presentation range for Christmas 2016. In the planning for years and kept away from prying eyes, the new packaging, utilised for their Cuvée Royale NV range, is stunning and features a specially commissioned bottle, unique to this Grande Marque, as well as brand new labelling and packaging details. LESSER KNOWN FRANCE

Bordeaux, Burgundy, the Rhône, Beaujolais...they make some brilliant bottles but it's time to break out of the French wine rut and discover some new gems. Words by Chris Goldman

If t can be very easy to get drawn into drinking the same wine over and over again, safe in the knowledge that it will most likely taste identical to the previous bottle you had. However, with so many grape varieties and styles on offer, a little exploration can go a very long way. Fear not, this is not a clarion call for you to disregard all wines without twigs floating in or that are a psychedelic shade of blue. This is about taking the road slightly less travelled yet steeped in history that rewards with wines that are better value and often more interesting.

Cahors, for any who have visited or passed through will know, is a beautiful place full of castles, art and history. However, wine has also been made here since Roman times with the first vines planted around 50BC. This is Malbec's home and the

Château Combel-La-Serre Le Pur Fruit du Causse is all about the fresh brambly fruit flavours of the grape with no oak.

Journey south west from Cahors and you come across an appellation called Madiran. In the heart of Gascony, it is rammed full of rich food and rich wines. These are not shy wines, the reds are made from Tannat, but are concentrated and full of power. However the best examples, like Tour Bouscasse from the region's master Alain Brumont, balance power with complexity and depth of flavour. This wine, made from grapes from 50-100 year old vines, is a wine to savour, luxuriate in and take your time over.

Darting eastwards, as I didn't promise an organised journey, you'll find yourself inland at the western

end of Provence bordering the Rhône Valley with mountains springing up everywhere. This is bargain hunting territory and we've found what is essentially a 'declassified' Gigondas with all the trappings of its more expensive counterpart but for under a tenner. Burle Domaine Florent et Damien Burle is big, hearty and gutsy—you can taste the Gigondas pedigree and your wallet will thank you at the same time.

A stone's throw away from here is the Ventoux region. In the stony soils of the southern slopes of the Dentelles de Montmirail is a 7.5 acre plot of Grenache and Syrah. Hand-picked and lightly crushed, the grapes receive the same care as the vineyard does and this is echoed in the resulting wine. **Mégaphone** is fresh yet structured with notes of liquorice and what the French term *garrigue*

essentially a catch-all phrase to describe the herby aromas from this part of the South of France
think thyme, rosemary, lavender and you'll be along the right lines.

KOPKE PORT

If you missed our stunning Kopke tasting in September you'll be delighted to hear we've teamed up with them again to bring you a world-class range for winter and beyond...

Where do we begin with Kopke Port? It's the oldest Port house, established in 1638, so it'll easily be the oldest wine producer you've never heard of! Kopke are a little bit different to the houses you may be familiar with though. The well-established names that we all know and love specialise in bottle aged Ports; Kopke's specialism is Port aged in barrel

for an extended, sometimes very extended, time. These wines are all about the harmony of fruit and barrel flavours and their offerings are stunning. With current release Ports dating back past 1934 they have an enviable archive of historic elixir waiting patiently in old barrels to be bottled upon order. Don't pigeon-hole these wines into a winter drink, as the brilliant

thing about these wines, which need to be drunk chilled, is that once you open them they will last for ages, unlike a bottle of vintage Port which will start to lose flavour within anything from a few hours to a few days. Just keep a bottle of Kopke in the fridge and dip in throughout the year!

KOPKE LBV 2011, DOURO – PG | This is one of the best LBVs I've tasted and comes from the outstanding 2011 vintage — arguably the 21st Century's best and lined up to be amongst the greats. This is all about ripe dark stone fruit and hints of cacao and chocolate. Full bodied and tight, this is showing some nice notes from its extended period in cask. £17.50 reduced to £15.99

KOPKE 10 YEAR OLD WHITE PORT, DOURO – PG No other producer has stocks of aged white Port like Kopke and this 10 Year Old is utterly unique. The star of our recent Kopke tutored tasting it's actually an average of 15 years old but this isn't a recognised age for cask aged Port. There's simply nothing else like this. It is deep golden, complex and difficult to describe as words simply do not do it justice. Deep and textured, drinking this reaffirms the adage of the importance of trying something new. I say this a lot but you must buy one of these for Christmas — it is unmissable. Serve from the fridge. 37.5cl £19.95 reduced to £17.95

KOPKE 10 YEAR OLD TAWNY, DOURO – PG Sweet fruits and molasses with masses of nuts, chocolate and vanilla — festive enough for you? Younger stated age Tawny Ports can taste a little bit harsh and unbalanced but not a bit of it with this from Kopke. Perfect balance and length and it'll last for ages once you open it. Serve from the fridge. £18.95 reduced to £16.95

KOPKE 30 YEAR OLD TAWNY, DOURO – PG In search of something with more concentration? This 30 Year Old Tawny represents outstanding value for money and is amazingly balanced. Vanilla and honey on the nose with a soft and concentrated palate of nuts and dried apricots. Sublime with an endless finish — rich but not unctuous. Take out of the fridge 15 minutes before serving. £57.50 reduced to £52.50

KOPKE 1998 COLHEITA, DOURO – PG As some of you may know, a Colheita is a barrel aged Port from a single year. These Ports vary from vintage to vintage and this 1998 hits all the right notes. Bright brown colour with reddish hints and a mass of dried fruit and spice. This is unctuous and utterly irresistable. Take out of the fridge 15 minutes before serving. *£36.50 reduced to £34.00*

KOPKE 1966 COLHEITA, DOURO – PG Yes, you read that correctly — 1966. I think this is the oldest wine to ever feature in The Grapevine. Intense brown with a brick red halo, it's full of dried fruit aromas and a touch of smoke illustrating superbly its longevity. As soon as you sip/taste/knock-back this the intensity of apricot, dried fig, walnut, coffee and vanilla is addictive. Bottled this year, it is liquid history. Take out of the fridge 15 minutes before serving. £127.50 reduced to £117.50





WHAT'S IN A NAME? LARGE FORMAT NOMENCLATURE

Nothing quite gets the party started like a large format bottle of wine. Not only do they look impressive but the contents will age at a much slower rate and have increased complexity over time compared to the same wine in a smaller bottle. Each size has it's own, usually Biblical, name and the most commonly seen are:

MAGNUM 1.5 Litres or 2 bottles. Latin for great; JEROBOAM 3L or 4 bottles. Biblical ~ first King of the northern Kingdom of Israel; DOUBLE MAGNUM 3L or 4 bottles. The equivalent of a 3L Jeroboam in Bordeaux; REHOBOAM 4.5L or 6 bottles. Biblical ~ first King of separate Judea; BORDEAUX JEROBOAM 5L or 6.75 bottles. As above; IMPERIAL 6L or 8 bottles; METHUSELAH 6L or 8 bottles. Biblical ~ oldest man at 969 years old; SALMANAZAR 9L or 12 bottles. Biblical ~ Assyrian King; BALTHAZAR 12L or 16 bottles. Biblical ~ one of the Wise Men; NEBUCHADNEZZAR 15L or 20 bottles. Biblical ~ King of Babylon; MELCHIOR 18L or 24 bottles. Biblical ~ one of the Wise Men; SOLOMON 20L or 26 bottles. Biblical ~ King Solomon; GOLIATH 27L or 36 bottles. Biblical ~ stoned by David; MELCHIZEDEK 30L or 40 bottles. Biblical ~ King of Salem

This means that from the 2016 vintage it will drop Côtes du Rhône Villages from its label and join such illustrious names as Châteauneuf-du-Pape and Crozes Hermitage. This magnum is testament to this village's potential. *150cl | £29.95 reduced to £19.95*

Bordeaux is undoubtedly the largest fine wine region of the world, however, it also has immensely exciting wines that are very affordable. Whilst the top châteaux have become a luxury investment commodity, the quality of some of the lesser estates, second labels and even everyday 'AC Bordeaux' labelled wines have sky-rocketed and are real value for money. Perfect wines, at every budget, for Christmas and beyond."

LA RÉSERVE DE MALARTIC 2011,

PESSAC-LÉOGNAN – FR The second label of one of my favourite estates, Château Malartic Lagravière, that showcases the newer wave of younger, dynamic owners of some great Bordeaux estates; employing a great balance of traditional and modern techniques, extracting as much quality and character as possible from every grape. The Bonnie family have produced a wonderful wine on some of the oldest wine producing land, situated to the south of the city in Pessac-Léognan. Medium bodied, dark fruits with a swipe of leathery tobacco spice." £22.50 reduced to £18.50

CHÂTEAU DU LORT 2012, BORDEAUX - FR

"A vinous wolf in sheep's clothing, this is no lowly Bordeaux rouge and punches well above its price and would give a lot of château-bottled wine a bloodied nose. This is mainly due to the incredible investment the Castel family have put in to both the vineyards and the winery. It's full bodied, smooth with a velvety texture and such finesse for the price." £11.99 reduced to £9.99

CHÂTEAU MONTLABERT 2013, SAINT-ÉMILION – FR "You could probably stand in the vineyard with a tennis racket and ball and with a hefty forehand hit the roof of the winery of first growth Cheval Blanc, that's how close this fantastic estate is to true St-Émilion excellence, yet at a fraction of the price. Again, a recent purchase followed by a towering investment from the Castel family, coupled with consultant winemaker Hubert de Bouard of the famous Château Angelus, made this one of the best value 'Grand Cru' status wines you will come across. Perfect for both a 'claret-nut' or a special occasion, it's medium-bodied and drinking beautifully with really complex pic 'n' mix flavours of plum, cocoa, liquorice and spice. Dive in headfirst, its deep enough here." £31.50 reduced to £26.50

RHÔNE – FR Sourced from 'Les Turcs', a single 7ha east-facing, terraced, high altitude vineyard in the hills behind the village of Séguret; planted with mostly Grenache intermingled with some Syrah, vines whose minimum age is 50, many older still. 98% Grenache with a smidgen of Syrah. This is as good as CDR gets. Plush, opulent and spicy with masses of rich fruit and integrated oak. Phwoar! £13.99 reduced to £9.99

PROSECCO BISCARDO SPUMANTE MILLESIMATO 2015, VENETO-IT

Elegant, delicate and aromatic Prosecco with hints of apples and honeysuckle. Very easy to enjoy! Vintage Prosecco for under £10. £11.99 reduced to £9.99

THE COURTESAN RIESLING 2016, CLARE VALLEY – AU | Excuse me? £8.99 for a

AUXEY-DURESSES LES DURESSES PREMIER CRU 2013, BURGUNDY

FR "Expressive wild strawberries, cranberries, thyme and violet aromas explode from this classy, pure Pinot Noir. Very appealing svelte, crunchy red fruit on the palate with an excellent









tannin structure. Lots of energy following through to the long and impressive finish. A very appealing, pretty wine." Decanter Wine Awards 2016: 95 points/100 Gold Medal, Platinum Trophy and Trophy for Best Red Côte de Beaune over £15. Christmas parcel £25.00 (normal price £29.50)

RULLY BLANC 2014, BURGUNDY - FR Rully,

located in the Côte Chalonnaise, produces wines which are expressive and pleasant to drink when young. The grapes come from a parcel located to the southwest of the village, above the famous Les Pucelles 1er Cru. Bordered by forest, this terroir retains plenty of freshness and is one of the last to be harvested in the area. The grapes are harvested by hand and fermentation takes place entirely in stainless steel vats, after which the wines are transferred by gravity into French oak barrels (20% new). The lees are not stirred (bâtonnage) during ageing, which lasts 11 months so the wine isn't overtly rich. A beautiful golden hue with green tints with an expressive fruity and floral nose. 
